

# GLOSSARY

## BUTLER DEFINITIONS

### **PART**

A singular item.

### **COMPONENT**

A combination of parts fitted together.

### **THE BUTLER MACHINE, MACHINE**

The combination of components as shown on schematic.

### **THE BUTLER SYSTEM, THE BUTLER, SYSTEM**

The combination of components as shown on schematic, as well as all Butler-equipped tanks, reels, signage, trim, etc.

### **THE UNIT, UNIT**

The combination of the Butler System and the vehicle itself.

### **THE BUTLER CORPORATION, BUTLER, BUTLER'S, THE BUTLER FACTORY, FACTORY, FACILITY, WE, US, OUR**

Refers to The Butler Corporation as located at 251 Moody St., Ludlow, Massachusetts.

### **WARRANTY**

The warranty as described in the Butler System Warranty Booklet.

### **PROCEDURE**

A sequence of instructions that must be followed from beginning to end.

### **SDS**

Safety Data Sheet.

### **TOOL**

A wand, upholstery tool, simulator nozzle, etc.

### **NUMBERS**

Numbers (example: 1010) indicate parts and components on schematic.

## VEHICLE MANUFACTURER DEFINITIONS

### **GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT (GVW)**

GVW is the actual weight of the entire vehicle and its contents, including fuel and occupants.

### **GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT RATING (GVWR)**

GVWR is the maximum amount of weight allowable, as established by the manufacturer for the vehicle, equipment, payload, fuel and occupants.

### **PAYLOAD**

Maximum allowable weight of cargo to be carried in a vehicle, including occupants. Computed by subtracting curb weight from GVWR.

### **GROSS PAYLOAD**

Amount of cargo a vehicle is rated to carry including the weight of options, equipment and occupants.

### **NET PAYLOAD**

Amount of cargo a vehicle is rated to carry less the weight of options, bodies, equipment and occupants.

### **GROSS COMBINATION WEIGHT RATING (GCWR)**

GCWR is the maximum amount of weight allowable, as established by the manufacturer for the vehicle, trailer, equipment, payload, fuel and occupants.
